

## TERM 4 2021-22

Welcome to the P1/2 newsletter. Still a short time to go to our Summer holiday and things to enjoy but what a wide range of activities we have covered this term so far! Happy Summer holiday when it arrives!

Literacy & English	Numeracy & Maths
EARLY LEVEL Pupils have been sounding out and blending automatically and using a super range of common words, reading them at sight. We have been firming up our knowledge of vowels, learning about the difference between sounds and names of the letters. This is important when learning to use a wider range of reading strategies. For example, for the word 'came', pupils would look at the vowels that work together and use the first vowel's name. In reading, pupils have been introduced to reading several sentences, looking to find where full stops end rather than assuming the end of a sentence finishes at the end of a line. In writing lessons, all pupils see themselves as writers, wanting to write several sentences with much more independence. <u>FIRST LEVEL</u> Pupil now have a good bank of reading strategies to choose from when faced with an unfamiliar word and are using these very well. In writing, the focus has been on using different sentence openers as well as using adjectives independently. We have also been learning about alphabetical order, using first and second letters of words.	EARLY and FIRST LEVEL <u>Time</u> We began Term 4 learning about time. Pupils have been learning about the difference between the big and little hand, the 24 hour clock, analogue and digital clocks. We will revisit time before the end of term looking at 1/2 hours, 1/4 past and 1/4 to the hour. <u>Money</u> We have also started learning about money. This can be a tricky concept to understand as there are less opportunities for pupils to have regular first hand experience of handling money. By the time you received this newsletter, we should have had a trip to The Pop In Shop, learning about the value of money.


## <u>HWB</u>

In PE lessons, Mrs Browne has introduced Athletics, including hurdles and the javelin. Mrs Telfer has been focusing on racket sports with pupils developing hand eye coordination using a tennis and badminton racket. For the rest of the term, team games will be the main focus including football. This will also help to dispel the stereotype that football is only for boys.

Throughout the year, there has been a focus on friendship, learning what makes a good friend as well as how to maintain friendships and this has been revisited. In addition, lessons have focused on healthy eating and life cycles. For the remainder of the term, the health and wellbeing focus will be body parts and privacy.

## Interdisciplinary Learning

An important feature of our term has been our visits to The Craigs. To begin with some pupils were reluctant to venture out into the wind and rain. I am very pleased to report that all pupils now enjoy The Craigs in all weather! We have been learning about and taking risks such as, "If I jump in the mud and it is deep, I might get very muddy and cold." Or, "When I walk through the wilder parts of The Craigs, I need to look out for nettles or I will get stung." Taking appropriate risks now, will help to build skills in pupils for taking and assessing risks later in life. We have also enjoyed regular 'Quite Times'. Pupils sit and listen to the sounds around them, focusing on how they feel and what they see. They do this very well and are becoming aware of the beauty of their surroundings as well as becoming better at expressing feelings. The resilience of pupil simply walking to and from The Craigs has much improved with all pupils being able to walk without feeling tired or asking to take the car, or to be carried! Great job P1/2!
